


COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN (CAPC) FACILITATOR

Under the direction of the Early Years Manager and the Early Years Coordinator, you will be responsible for promoting and creating partnerships to strengthen Indigenous families with children up to six years old by providing programming and services that support and enhance healthy child development. CAPC programming consists of drop-ins, individual sessions, group sessions, home visits, and outreach. This posting is for a full-time position.
